

Chairman's welcome



In my spring message I encouraged us all to think about the quality of our performance – our striking – and some ways that we could improve it. Since ringing is a team effort the result depends on how well each individual performs, controlling the bell and helping to develop a shared rhythm. We teach bell control skills, which are easier to focus on, but we tend to neglect rhythm skills, which are more difficult to teach. If the rhythm provided by other ringers is not very rhythmic then it's hard to know what is due to that and what is due to you.

When I started ringing the only hope was to ring with a band of very good ringers – a luxury that most of us don't have. But we now have simulators, so you can ring with perfect 'ringers' and get detailed feedback on how well you did and where to improve. (For more information see: http://jaharrison.me.uk/Ringing/Simulators/). Over the years we've run many Branch sessions to give this opportunity to members whose tower has no simulators.

We've run these periodically like our other courses by finding a date/time when students and tutors can get together (typically four and two in this case). But that's very infrequent. The ideal is more often, and several peo-

ple have asked for repeat sessions.

As an experiment I intend to offer more frequent, smaller, 'first come first served' sessions. I will choose times, notify them via the mailing list and accept the first two responses. If there are no responses it won't happen.

Would you like to improve your ringing by practising with a simulator? Look out for emails with details.

If all towers had simulators you could get far more practice than we can provide at Branch level, and even those who can't find time for extra sessions would benefit because the more members of a band develop a reliable rhythm the better everyone's ringing experience becomes. Have you ever asked why your tower doesn't have what is now a well developed, readily available teaching tool?

Cost need not be a barrier, and both the Guild and the Branch offer grants to help. A basic system using one bell can be had for tens of pounds, and even a system to allow several ringers to practice independently on any of the bells would cost far less than any other aspect of a bell installation

Lack of knowhow may put people off, but within the Branch we have plenty of knowledge and advice to help if needed. Installation entails some practical work, but needs little more than DIY skills, and there are books and websites about the use of simulators.

Would your tower like to explore having a simulator in your tower? Contact me to find out more.

As well as simulators there are many other things that can make training and practice easier or more effective, all of which could potentially benefit from support grants. Branch grants are similar in principle but could cover any investment to enhance ringing, for example sound control to remove constraints on teaching and practice time.
